'The evocative image used by Amos speaks to us of what God desires.

God wants justice to reign; it is as essential to our life as God's children made in his likeness as water is essential for our physical survival.

This justice must flow forth wherever it is needed, neither remaining hidden deep beneath the ground nor vanishing like water that evaporates before it can bring substance.

God wants everyone to strive to be just in every situation, to live according to his laws and thus to enable life to flourish. When we seek first the kingdom of God, maintaining a right relationship with God, humanity and nature, then justice and peace can flow like a never-failing stream of pure water, nourishing humanity and all creatures.'

Rather than a problem to be solved, the world is a joyful mystery to be contemplated with gladness and praise. (LS 12)
